

Cork, a world to discover

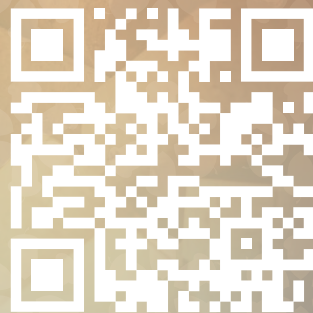

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The great Cork Trail

Linear route  

The great Cork Trail runs through Spain, following a central thread that beats in the bark of each cork oak. More than an itinerary, it is a living narrative that brings together territories, trades and shared memories centred on a tree that has given sustenance, identity and culture throughout history.

Crossing Spain from north to south and from east to west, the trail is a cultural and natural journey that connects dehesas (pasturelands planted with cork oak trees), forests, mountains, communities and experiences. At each stop, visitors discover how much cork has been and still is a circular economy, forging collective identities and creating immaterial heritage. Travellers following this trail see more than trees: they discover a whole world through its bark.

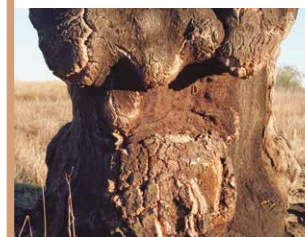

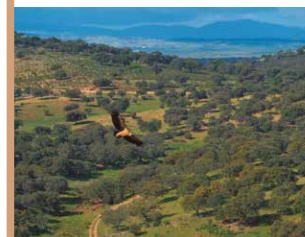
